2.3.1. Turbine Cloud 26.2.2 Release

July 21, 2026

Turbine Cloud 26.2.2 is a minor release that includes bug fixes and improvements addressing issues identified in the 26.2.0 release.

Addressed Issues

Applications and Records

- **Reference Fields Missing from Reports and API Responses:** Resolved an issue where reference field values appeared in full record views but were empty in reports and Record API responses. Reference field values now display correctly and consistently across all three.
- **Duplicate Comments Created by Repeated Submissions:** Fixed an issue where repeatedly clicking Submit while editing a record comment created duplicate comments. Comment updates now process only one submission while the update is in progress.

Playbook Runs

- **Run Again Option Missing for Playbook Runs:** Fixed an issue where the Run Again button was unavailable for completed production runs in the Test Console. The Run Again option is now available for completed production, test, and draft runs.
- **Component Outputs Included Unrelated Upstream Data:** Fixed an issue where a component's published output included merged output from earlier connectors and sub-playbooks. Published component results now contain only the output produced by the component action.

Canvas

- **Discovered Webhook Outputs Disappeared After Saving:** Fixed an issue where outputs discovered from webhook triggers disappeared after you saved, refreshed, or reopened the playbook. Discovered outputs now persist after saving or reopening the playbook.
- **Record Correlation Triggers Could Be Removed During Cleanup:** Fixed an issue where record correlation triggers were removed in certain edge cases when the orchestration task identifier differed from the correlation configuration identifier. Correlation triggers now remain available after cleanup processing.

2.5.1. Turbine Cloud 26.0.0 Release

Turbine 26.0.0: Smarter AI and a Better User Experience

Turbine 26.0.0 introduces powerful AI-driven capabilities and key platform improvements to make building, running, and managing automations easier and more reliable.

This release introduces AI SOC, bringing AI assistance directly into security workflows. AI SOC enables teams to start using AI across alert triage, investigation, and response. Hero AI Companion now includes Playbook Building Mode, allowing users to create and update playbooks using natural language. This significantly reduces the time and effort needed to build complex automation playbooks.

The release also includes improvements in the overall user experience and platform scalability. Code editors now support full-screen mode for easier editing of long scripts. Users can view component errors and run details directly from playbook runs for better troubleshooting.

Overall, Turbine 26.0.0 strengthens Swimlane's position as an intelligent automation backbone for enterprises, where automation and AI work together seamlessly to drive efficiency, speed, and better security outcomes.

What's New in this Release

AI-Driven Security Operations (AI SOC)

Turbine 26.0.0 introduces foundational capabilities for AI-driven security operations (AI SOC), combining traditional SOC workflows with AI-powered capabilities to accelerate security operations, reduce false positives, and enhance analyst productivity through intelligent automation.

The AI SOC solution integrates Hero AI capabilities throughout SOC workflows, enabling intelligent alert analysis to determine true/false positives and prioritize threats, automated threat intelligence correlation that synthesizes results from multiple providers, case investigation assistance with AI-powered recommendations and remediation guidance, and knowledge management with context-aware access to procedures and best practices.

These experiences are powered by Hero AI Deep Agents: the Investigation and Response Agent assists analysts in triaging and investigating incoming signals, the Playbook Generator Agent helps create playbooks to automate and streamline investigation and response workflows, and the Ingestion Agent accelerates onboarding by connecting to third-party APIs to ingest alerts and signals. AI SOC Ingestion makes it faster to connect sources and bring alerts and signals into AI SOC, reducing time to value.

2.6.1.4. Turbine Cloud 25.5.1 Release

This release improves the reliability of event-driven playbooks, sub-playbook execution, and connector actions, helping automations run more consistently.

Playbook Execution Reliability Improvements

This release contains minor improvements and bug fixes to increase reliability of event driven playbooks. It improves how event-driven playbooks are queued and run so they are less likely to be missed, stuck, or dropped. These improvements also made sub-playbooks and connector actions more reliable so runs don't fail or show the wrong status due to temporary issues. Overall, automations will run more smoothly.

2.6.2. Turbine Cloud 25.4.0 Release

Turbine 25.4.0 delivers major upgrades across the platform, bringing smarter automation, deeper operational insights, and an improved user experience.

This release delivers a major upgrade to Hero AI, now powered by Anthropic's Claude models, offering faster, more accurate, and context-aware responses across the platform. The new AI foundation improves scalability, reliability, and reasoning, providing a smarter and more dependable Hero AI experience while maintaining Swimlane's enterprise-grade security and data privacy standards.

This release also includes several key platform enhancements like condition builders have been enhanced to support new operator contains any for array conditions, enabling more precise filtering of array-type data. The Operational Health experience has been redesigned to unify Runs, Events, and Alerts into a single, streamlined view.

The Send Notification feature has been refined with clearer terminology, co-branded emails, updated footers, and optimized frequency settings for a more consistent notification experience.

There are many usability enhancements such as enhanced report-column management and the ability to open incidents or records in new browser tabs, make navigating and multitasking across Turbine smoother than ever.

Turbine 25.4.0 continues to evolve the platform with a focus on intelligence, visibility, and seamless user experience.

2.6.2.1. What's New in this Release

Hero AI powered by Anthropic's Claude models

- **Advanced Multi-Model Strategy:** Hero AI is now powered by Anthropic's Claude Sonnet and Haiku models. These state-of-the-art models provide faster, more contextually aware responses and better comprehension across automation and analysis tasks.

2.6.3.2. Addressed Issues

Canvas

- **Record Actions – Timeout When Serialization Errors Occur:** Fixed an issue where record action jobs could time out if serialization errors occurred during result processing. The system now handles serialization errors gracefully, marking the job as failed without causing timeouts, which improves resiliency and reliability for record actions.
- **Search Record Actions – Input Validation for Limit Field in Native Search:** In previous versions, setting the limit field in the native search record action to an empty string ("") caused it to behave like an "all" filter. Starting with 25.3.1, setting this field to "" now triggers an input validation error.
- **Playbook Buttons – Unintended Execution on Record Save:** Fixed an issue where playbook buttons could trigger unintentionally after saving a record. If a user previously selected a playbook button but canceled the confirmation dialog, the playbook would still execute upon saving the record. This behavior has been corrected to ensure canceled actions do not persist across user interactions, maintaining expected automation behavior.
- **Playbooks – Retry Action Logic Fixed for Failed Executions:** Fixed an issue where actions configured with retry logic were not executing retries as expected when the action failed. Previously, playbooks would fail immediately without attempting the configured number of retries, even when retry conditions were set.

Records and Reports

- **Cross-Tenant Role Permission Cleanup in Scheduled Reports:** Fixed an issue where permissions for a duplicated role were not removed from the original tenant when the role was reassigned to a different tenant. This caused outdated role references to appear in report scheduling. Permissions are now deleted from the original tenant's database during reassignment, ensuring accurate tenant isolation and preventing cross-tenant role visibility.
- **Tooltip Alignment in Report View:** Fixed an issue where tooltips for multiline text fields in the Report view appeared misaligned when the content was long, extending unevenly toward the right. Tooltips are now positioned consistently, improving readability and visual alignment.
- **Condition Builder Filter Type Changing with Color Coding:** Fixed an issue where changing the filter type in the color coding module also changed the filter type in the condition builder. The condition builder's filter type now remains independent and is no longer affected by changes in the color coding module.
- **Performance Improvements for Load Times:** Improved performance when sorting records by timestamp fields, resulting in faster load times.
- **Enhanced Editing Experience:** When values are edited by multiple sources, non-conflicting changes are preserved and users are prompted only when conflicts occur.
- **Content Overlapping in Read-Only Mode:** Fixed an issue where content in a rich-text field set to read-only mode could overlap other components when the content included fixed widths. The component now displays scrollbars in read-only mode to prevent layout overlap and maintain proper alignment with other controls.

2.6.4.2. Addressed Issues

Reports

- Resolved an issue where special characters like `\t` and `\n` were incorrectly rendered as actual tabs or line breaks in reports. These characters are now displayed properly, ensuring data appears as expected.
- Resolved an issue where charts failed to display values when record data included Korean text. Chart labels and legends now fully support Korean, Japanese, Arabic, and other character-based languages, ensuring accurate and clear representation across multilingual record data.

Canvas

- Resolved an issue where some playbooks displayed incorrect names and opened the wrong page when accessed from the Orchestration → Events view. With this update, playbook names now appear correctly and open in the expected Canvas editor.
- Resolved an issue where playbooks could not be saved if an action included discovered outputs with nested array data. The issue caused an error during save, especially when outputs had advanced structures. Playbooks with advanced output structures now save correctly without errors.
- Resolved an issue where conditions set in actions inside parallel groups within loops were not visible in the UI. Now, these conditions correctly show up, making it easier to view and update them when configuring playbooks.
- Resolved an issue causing a “System Error” when accessing job details for component runs older than one hour. Details are now displayed without any issue.

Records

- Resolved an issue that prevented record create or update actions from succeeding when the input included small decimal values. These values were incorrectly rejected, even though they worked when submitted through the UI. The system now properly handles small numeric values, including those in scientific notation, during record actions.

SSP Import/Export

- Resolved an issue where attempting to export a package caused a Maximum Call Stack Size Exceeded error. This occurred when components had circular references, such as when Component A referenced Component B, which in turn referenced Component A. The fix now prevents duplicate processing of already-handled components, allowing the export to complete successfully.

Content Library

- Improved how publishing works when multiple users attempt to publish packages at the same time. Previously, a short lock timeout could lead to inaccurate attribution in the “CreatedBy” field. The lock duration is now configurable and set to 10 minutes by default, reducing the risk of conflicting updates and improving data integrity during concurrent publishing.

Classic Playbook Re-run Timeout

- Resolved an issue where re-running a Classic Playbook through the API resulted in a timeout

2.6.5.7. Turbine Cloud 25.1.8 Release

This update improves features to resolve the issues found in Turbine Cloud 25.1.0.

Addressed Issues

Canvas

- **Flow name input refresh streamlined**
- Improved the user experience by ensuring flow names are updated only when a user confirms changes (for example, by pressing Tab or clicking off). This eliminates unnecessary updates during typing.
- **Obfuscation and Record Export Action**
- In previous releases, the Obfuscation and Record Export Action features were controlled by a feature flag. Starting with this release, these features will be available by default.

Playbooks

- **Playbook Runs When Connector Is Deleted**

Resolved an issue where playbooks using a deleted connector could get stuck in an "active" state. Previously, instead of properly failing, the playbook would encounter an internal error during the failure process, causing background jobs to error out.

The fix ensures:

- Playbooks fail gracefully when a required connector has been deleted.
- Background jobs no longer throw errors in this scenario.

This improves system reliability and ensures failed playbook runs are correctly timed out.

SSP Import/Export

- Resolved an issue that caused SSP exports to fail when a solution or component ID was missing. The system now displays an error message but allows the export to proceed.

Records

- **Removing Values in List Fields**
- Resolved an issue where removing a single instance of a value from a text or numeric list field in the record UI would incorrectly remove all occurrences of that value upon saving. The issue is now resolved and only the selected instance is removed, and other duplicates remain as expected. This ensures more accurate and predictable updates to list fields when the GlobalRecordPatching feature is enabled.
- **Component creation with grouped actions**
- Resolved an issue that prevented components from being created when triggered through grouped action sets. Grouped actions now work with component generation as expected.

2.6.6.2. Addressed Issues

- **Remote Agents:**
 - Fixed an issue where remote-agent deployments using Podman as a host did not function correctly due to low process and file limits.
 - Fixed an issue where the remote-agent may not recover from a container-engine hangup.
- **Performance Improvements:**
 - Enhancements made to database performance for robust playbook executions.
 - Improved the reliability of connector transfers to remote agents for more stable performance.
 - Fixed an issue where viewing a large revision history caused browser out-of-memory errors.
 - Resolved a memory leak in QoS Serve (Quality of Service), ensuring improved performance and stability.
- **Triggers:** Improved triggers evaluations and enhanced the code to ensure reliable and consistent trigger handling.
- **Large Text Field Handling:** Improved large text handling by ensuring large text fields are passed as proper file objects, enabling seamless use in all playbook actions that process files.
- **Record Actions with UserGroups:** Enhanced the UserGroup field to support all field-level configurations, including accepting members from both groups and subgroups. Resolved issues with native record actions for the UserGroup field, ensuring proper retrieval and handling of "Members of X" and "Subgroups of X" options during user/group field operations.
- **User Groups and Filters:** Resolved an issue where User/Group filters displayed all account users instead of being filtered according to the application's configuration.
- **Content Library:**
 - Resolved an issue with incorrect content counts being displayed. Now content count is displayed correctly.
 - Resolved an issue where Push/Pull buttons were visible when they should not have been.
- **Audit Logs:** Enhanced the logging experience by adding more logs.
- **Usage Metrics Dashboard:** Fixed an issue where the chart was extending beyond the width of the page. Added virtual scrolling to tables for improved performance and user experience.
- **Canvas:**
 - **Transformation Actions:**
 - Resolved an issue where string interpolation was not generated correctly in advanced transformation blocks for Transformation actions.
 - Resolved an issue in the Transform Data action where malformed JSONata expressions or invalid syntax caused schema errors instead of generating properly formatted error messages.
 - **Action Naming:** Resolved an issue where properties with keys starting with numbers or special characters were not handled correctly. Numeric action names are now properly supported and processed.

2.6.7.4.2. Addressed Issues

- **Reports:**
 - Resolved an issue where ampersands (&) were not displayed correctly in reports. Ampersands now render properly in all reports.
 - Resolved an issue where exported reports displayed misaligned tables and inconsistent layouts in certain graphs. Graph reports now retain proper alignment and layout after export.
 - Resolved an issue that prevented the rearrangement of columns in application records. Users can now rearrange columns to their desired positions seamlessly.
 - Addressed an issue where records were not loading when a custom color was configured for a multi select and a record does not have a value for that field.
- **Remote Agent:**
 - Addressed an issue where a connector could write excessive data to its output stream, preventing proper error reporting for the action.
 - Fixed an issue where updates to remote agents with specific configurations failed to complete successfully. The remote agent installer now provides warnings when images cannot be pulled, instead of returning an error.
 - The remote agent installer now only warns when images cannot be pulled instead of erroring.
- **Playbooks:**
 - Triggers: Resolved an issue with playbook triggers where inconsistencies between YAML and orchestration tasks occasionally prevented triggers from firing. Playbook triggers now rely solely on YAML for evaluating trigger conditions, ensuring consistent behavior.

2.6.8.8.1. Addressed Issues

- **Playbook: Sub Playbook Configuration with Repeat**
- Fixed an issue where properties marked as promoted were not being promoted when a sub-playbook was configured with a repeat. The fix ensures that promotion now works accurately.

2.6.8.8.2. Known Issues

- **Canvas: Sensitive Data Feature**
- There is a minor bug in the sensitive data feature where sensitive results from sub-playbook action used in a loop or repeat in the parent playbook will not be obfuscated in the parents results. A fix for this issue will be included in the next release.
- **Canvas: Dragging an IF Action Between Two Actions**
- There are instances where dragging an IF action between two actions on the graph may cause performance issues. If you notice any performance impact, log a support ticket. Our team will provide a workaround to resolve the issue. A permanent fix for this issue will be included in the next release.

2.6.8.11.1. Addressed Issues

- **Playbooks**
 - Playbook Test Panel: Addressed an issue in the playbook test panel where inputs set to a false value were incorrectly removed from the test data.
 - Native HTTP Action: Addressed an issue with native HTTP actions where user-specified Content-Type header values were being overwritten.
 - Addressed an issue which prevented users from mapping playbook inputs when configuring playbook buttons in the Application Builder UI.
- **Record Trigger Conditions:** Addressed an issue with the record trigger condition where if a user adds a playbook property references inside a string, on the right side of operations in the condition builder was not being evaluated during a playbook run. This update ensures that the condition builder evaluates these references correctly, making all functionality in the UI work as expected.
- **Engine:** Addressed an issue where jobs could be processed out of order due to significant clock skew between nodes.
- **Native Record Action**
 - Improved the functionality of value selection fields in native record actions. Previously, when selecting values dynamically (using expressions or playbook property references), it was required to send the ID of the selection value instead of the value itself. Starting with version 24.2.5, both single and multi-select value selection fields can now accept IDs, values, or a combination of both when using dynamic values.
 - Addressed an issue where the record details drawer would not close when clicking outside the drawer area.
 - Improved the functionality of user/group fields in native record actions. Previously, using dynamic data (expressions or playbook property references) required sending the full object of the user or group. In version 24.2.5, you can now send any mix of usernames, display names, IDs, or email addresses for users, and the group name for groups, for both single and multi-select fields.
- **Turbine Record Actions:** Addressed an issue where while applying restrictions on records were throwing errors. Fix ensures that record restrictions would work as expected in Turbine Record Action

3.1. Turbine On-Prem 26.4.x Release

3.1.1. Turbine On-Prem 26.4.1 Release

Turbine 26.4.1: More Flexibility, Better Control, Smoother Automation.

Turbine 26.4 includes new capabilities and improvements that make automation easier to manage, integrate, and recover. Webhooks can now return customized confirmation messages, HTML landing pages, or JSON responses for automated integrations, while Hero AI actions can return structured JSON that can be used directly by downstream playbook steps. Administrators also gain greater control over Hero AI usage with monthly soft and hard credit caps and usage notifications to help monitor consumption. In addition, playbook imports provide seamless event processing by allowing playbooks and webhooks to be enabled automatically after import and automatically reprocessing events that were skipped while the package was being imported. Together, these enhancements help teams run automation more predictably, with clearer integration outcomes, greater control over AI usage, and smoother recovery during content changes.

3.4.1.2. Turbine On-Prem 26.1.3 Release

June 11, 2026

Turbine **26.1.3** includes a fix that restores reliable behavior for applet field keys on applications and playbooks that reference those fields.

Addressed Issues

Applications and Applets

- **Applet Field Keys Reverted to Dotted Notation:** In **26.1.2**, field keys for fields added to an application from an applet changed from dotted notation (for example, `abc.sla_status`) to underscore notation (for example, `abc_sla_status`). **26.1.3** restores the original dotted format for newly added applet fields. Field keys created on **26.1.2** are not changed automatically. If a playbook or **widget** was created or updated using those underscore keys and it worked before the hotfix, it should continue to work after the hotfix.
If a Record Action maps the target application instead of selecting it from the dropdown, and that application still has underscore applet keys from **26.1.2**, the action may fail after the hotfix. To resolve this, remove the applet from the application and add it again so the fields regenerate with dotted keys. Then update any playbook, component, or widget mappings that still reference the old underscore keys.

3.4.1.3. Turbine On-Prem 26.1.2 Release

Turbine 26.1.2 includes new features, enhancements, and bug fixes focused on platform performance and reliability.

What's new in this Release?

Custom LLM for Hero AI

Turbine 26.1.2 introduces Custom LLM, which lets account administrators configure which models power Hero AI instead of using default platform routing alone.
